Form 116 Possible Community Needs

(Note: Not all of these needs are funding priorities, as defined in the Consolidated Plan, of the ACEDP.)

- Water systems--source, storage, treatment, and distribution
- Wastewater systems--treatment and collection
- Flood protection/drainage improvements--channel improvements, levees, stabilization
- Fire protection--facilities and equipment
- Housing improvements--rehabilitation of existing single or multi-family structures
- Streets, roads, and bridges--construction and reconstruction
- Community/neighborhood centers--multi-use, senior citizens centers, libraries, social service facilities and centers for the handicapped
- Solid waste systems--disposition and collection
- Recreation facilities--active and passive outdoor and indoor facilities
- Economic development--downtown revitalization, infrastructure to support industrial expansion or location
- Handicap access--elevators, ramps, rails, removal of architectural barriers to the handicapped in eligible structures and facilities
- Energy generation and distribution facilities-gaslines, solar, electric
- Code enforcement
- Demolition and clearance
- Construction, rehabilitation, expansion of schools
- Construction, expansion, rehabilitation of hospitals, nursing homes, public health facilities
- Utility hookups--to existing water, wastewater, or natural gas systems

The activities below might be identified as community priorities at public hearings; however, these activities are *ineligible* for ACEDP funding.

- Construction, expansion, rehabilitation of any building of general local government use such as city hall or county courthouse, police station, sheriff office, jail or detention facility
- Political activities
- Operation and maintenance activities
- Construction of new housing
- New police equipment
- Regular street maintenance
- Repair, painting and maintenance to water tanks
- Cleanup campaigns
